

MINUTES of the CITY OF MILO COUNCIL MEETING
CITY HALL, 100 MAIN ST, MILO, IOWA – MONDAY, APRIL 5, 2021

Milo City Council was called to order by Mayor Hall at 7:01 p.m. Council answering roll call: Kinser, Moulds, Wadle, Uttley and Mason. The Pledge of Allegiance was administered.

Motion by Moulds to approve the agenda. Second by Mason. Ayes: Kinser, Moulds, Wadle, Uttley and Mason. Nays: none. Motion approved.

Motion by Mason to approve the agenda to include all council meeting minutes of March 15, 2021; accounts payable from March 16 – April 5, 2021 in the amount of \$35,751.43. Second by Wadle. Ayes: Kinser, Moulds, Wadle, Uttley and Mason. Nays: none. Motion approved.

Old business, Mayor Hall directed council to review the signed Contractor Agreement and Performance Bond. City Clerk shared she had received an insurance bond.

Doug Hembry shared that Commonwealth Electric provided a bid to the lighting project and we are still awaiting more bids. Mayor Hall asked Kinser to follow-up with his source for a bid. Discussion followed.

Departmental reports: Doug Hembry said he had been busy repairing potholes and delivering rock along with normal park opening duties. Discussion followed about Council City Park Cleanup slated for April 11, 2021. Then, Renee Hembry, Library Director, reported that the Library Building Fund is at \$125,000. Adopt a book is going well. It has raised \$800.00 and runs through May 18, 2021. Programming incentives for reading books continues. The Library will be having summer reading program the entire summer to accommodate social distancing. Sign up will be required. The Easter Egg Hunt was a big success! Big thank you to the group that helped fill eggs for the event! Council departmental reports were as follows: Kinser-public safety: no report/questions. Moulds-utilities: no report/questions. Uttley-parks: no report/questions. Mason-general items: no report/questions. Wadle-streets: no report/questions.

Under new business, Council reviewed and discussed information resulting in the following: Motion by Moulds to approve Resolution 2021–07 Setting Public Hearing for a Proposed Sale of Alley for May 3, 2021 at 7:00 pm at Milo City Hall. Second by Wadle. Ayes: Kinser, Moulds, Wadle, Uttley, and Mason. Nays: none. Motion carried. Then, motion by Wadle to approve Resolution 2021-09 Acknowledging the Offset of Uncollected Debt to the State of Iowa Offsetting Agency. Second by Mason. Ayes: Kinser, Moulds, Wadle, Uttley, and Mason. Nays: none. Motion carried. Next, motion by Moulds to approve Resolution 2021-10 Authorizing the Modification of Wages for FY2021. Second by Mason. Ayes: Kinser, Moulds, Wadle, Uttley, and Mason. Nays: none. Motion carried. Council then reviewed the 2020 Department of Natural Resources Tree Inventory for Milo, Iowa; discussed the FY2021 budget amendments and the Council City Park cleanup schedule for 2021 with Mayor Hall noting that each council person be responsible for finding a replacement if they cannot be there on their scheduled date. Then, they discussed the Iowa Community Assurance Pool information update.

No public comments were heard. Propositions and remarks were heard from Mayor Hall that there are trash bags at the Milo City Dump. Doug Hembry said he is aware of the situation and has followed up. City Clerk said that information regarding the use of the Milo City Dump is in the April Newsletter. Health, Safety and Information Committee discussed the 811 Call Before You Dig handout. Motion by Wadle to adjourn at 7:35 p.m. Second by Moulds. Ayes: all present. Motion approved.
