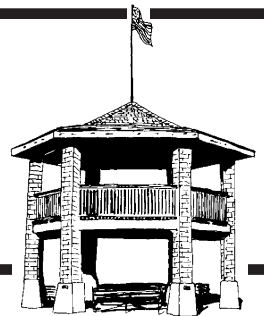

MINUTES of the CITY OF MILO COUNCIL MEETING

CITY HALL, MILO, IOWA –
MONDAY, MARCH 20, 2023

Milo City Council was called to order by Mayor Hall at 7:00 p.m. Council answering the Clerk's roll call: Wadle, Uttley and Mason. Absent: Kinser and Rasmussen. Mayor Hall administered the Pledge of Allegiance.

Motion by Mason and second by Wadle to approve the agenda. Ayes: Wadle, Uttley and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: Kinser and Rasmussen. Motion approved.

Motion by Mason to approve the consent agenda to include all council meeting minutes of March 6, 2023; accounts payable from March 7 - 20, 2023, in the amount of \$8,425.52; and the February 2023 bank reconciliation report. Second by Wadle. Ayes: Wadle, Uttley and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: Kinser and Rasmussen. Motion approved.

After reviewing old business, motion by Uttley to approve Country Propane bid in the amount of \$3,630.84 to replace one hanging furnace in the fire department sallyport per the quote. Second by Mason. Roll call vote: Ayes: Wadle, Uttley and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: Kinser and Rasmussen. Motion approved.

After reviewing new business, resulting in the following actions: Mayor completed the third reading of Ordinance 2023-03 amending the sewer rates for the City of Milo, Iowa. Motion by Wadle to approve the third reading of Ordinance 2023-03 and directed the City Clerk to publish the ordinance. Second by Mason. Roll call vote: Ayes: Wadle, Uttley and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: Kinser and Rasmussen. Motion approved. Next, motion by Wadle and second by Mason to approve Resolution 2023-11 authorizing submission of delinquent ambulance billing accounts to the Iowa Income Offset Program for collection. Roll call vote: Ayes: Wadle, Uttley and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: Kinser and Rasmussen. Motion approved. Then, after reviewing the parcel split request information, motion by Wadle and second by Uttley to approve the parcel split request from Lone Pine Farms, Inc. located outside of Milo city limits along S23 Highway and known as Parcel H. Ayes: Wadle, Uttley and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: Kinser and Rasmussen. Motion approved. Council tabled the Sheriff's Contract to review time spent in Milo. The purchase of a copier at city hall is tabled to obtain more bids.

Council reviewed the Fy2024 Milo City Budget and

upon a motion by Mason and second by Wadle approved the Fy2024 Milo City Budget and set it for hearing on April 17, 2023 at 7:00 p.m. at Milo City Hall, 100 Main Street, Milo, Iowa. Ayes: Wadle, Uttley and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: Kinser and Rasmussen. Motion approved.

There were no public comments. Council briefly discussed recycle and clean up and Clerk stated that all information will be in the April Milo Newsletter. Motion by Wadle to adjourn at 7:40 p.m. Second by Mason. Ayes: All present. Motion approved.

CURFEW FOR MINORS

Milo Ordinance Chapter 46

City of Milo Ordinance 46.01 CURFEW. "The Council has determined that a curfew for minors is necessary to promote the public health, safety, morals, and general welfare of the City and specifically to reinforce the primary authority and responsibility of adults responsible for minors; to protect the public from the illegal acts of minors committed after the curfew hour; and to protect minors from improper influences and criminal activity that prevail in public places after the curfew hour...". "2. Curfew Established. **No minor shall be in a public place between the following hours: Sunday – Thursday 11:00 p.m. – 5:00 a.m. and Friday – Saturday 12:00 midnight – 5:00 a.m.**". MINUTES of the CITY OF MILO COUNCIL MEETING

CITY HALL, MILO, IOWA – MONDAY, APRIL 3, 2023

Milo City Council was called to order by Mayor Hall at 7:00 p.m. Council answering the Clerk's roll call: Kinser, Wadle, Uttley and Mason. Absent: Rasmussen. Mayor Hall administered the Pledge of Allegiance.

Motion by Mason and second by Uttley to approve the agenda. Ayes: Kinser, Wadle, Uttley and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: Rasmussen. Motion approved.

Motion by Mason to approve the consent agenda to include all council meeting minutes of March 20, 2023; accounts payable from March 21 – April 3, 2023, in the amount of \$35,102.37. Second by Mason. Ayes: Kinser, Wadle, Uttley and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: Rasmussen. Motion approved.

Under old business, Clerk shared that the lagoon preparation has begun for the wastewater project. Council departmental reports: Kinser-public safety: Kinser commented on the quick response and expertise of the Milo Fire Department for the fire at the Primary School today. Rasmussen-utilities: absent-no report/questions. Wadle-streets: no report/questions. Uttley-parks: no report/questions. Mason-general items: no report/questions. Doug Hembry was absent.

After reviewing information and previous reports, Council discussed the 28E Agreement with the Warren County Sheriff and asked that Sheriff Carico attend a future meeting to discuss duration of time spent in Milo and law enforcement needs of Milo. The city hall copier was tabled to the next meeting while awaiting bids.

There was no public in attendance. Mason shared a citizen's concern regarding a tree on the City right-of-way that is hollow and needs removed. Clerk will let Doug know. Mason then asked about prebuilt structures and how they are assessed. Clerk stated that the Milo building permit is required to be submitted to the Warren County Assessor and that they are the entity that determines values.

Motion by Mason to adjourn at 7:28 p.m. Second by Wadle. Ayes: All present. Motion approved.

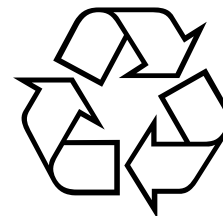

Summer Reading Program is right around the corner. This year it is required that you register your child for Summer Reading Program. We are changing things up a little bit so I need to know how many kids I have for each program. Some programs will only be open to a certain number of children so it is first come first serve. I would register my kids ASAP as the activities are fun and will most likely fill up quickly. These programs will be for kids from K-6th grade. Following is a rundown of times and dates and an overview of what we will do each day.

- **Thursday, June 1st 9:00 -10:30 - This will be our Perler Bead Activity Day.** Perler beads are a bead that you create a design with on a pattern board and then melt the beads with an iron. Miss Tiffani and I will be doing the heat process of this activity so no worries. We will also have stories, snack STEM activities on other things going on during this program. This program will be open to 20 children.
- **Thursday, June 8th 9:00 – 10:30 – We will have a creative day for this program.** We will be using blank canvas and paints, clay and many different things to bring out the artist in your child. - **Thursday, June 22nd 9:00 – 10:30 – Exploring Fairytales.** This is by far my favorite program we are doing because I love fairytales. We will be reading several fairytales and talking about them and we will also be creating our own very unique fairy gardens. This program will be open to 30 children.

We have worked really hard developing these programs this year. If you sign your child up please make sure they can attend. Please do not sign up on Facebook. You must either, come in library, call, email or use messenger. I will send you a confirmation if you sign up on email or messenger. Sign -up deadline is May 22nd. This gives me time to

get all supplies ordered.

Call 811 Before you Dig

811 is the national number designated by the Federal Communications Commission to help protect homeowners and professional excavators from unintentionally hitting underground utility lines while working on digging projects – large and small.

Every digging project requires a call to 811. Hitting an underground utility line can harm the environment, cause serious personal injuries, disrupt service to an entire neighborhood and potentially incur fines and repair costs. Some common examples of when to call 811 are: installing a rural mailbox, putting up a fence, planting trees or shrubbery, building a patio or deck, excavating a new garden area, etc.

Call 811 at least two days prior to digging which will start the process of this FREE service. Please visit www.call811.com for more information. Be safe! Call 811 before you dig!
