

### MINUTES of the CITY OF MILO COUNCIL MEETING

CITY HALL, MILO, IOWA - MONDAY, APRIL 17, 2023

Milo City Council was called to order by Mayor Hall at 7:00 p.m. Council answering the Clerk's roll call: Kinser, Wadle, Uttley and Mason. Absent: Rasmussen. Mayor Hall administered the Pledge of Allegiance.

Motion by Mason and second by Kinser to approve the amended agenda to include under old business the copier contract. Ayes: Kinser, Wadle, Uttley and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: Rasmussen. Motion approved.

Motion by Mason to approve the consent agenda to include all Council meeting minutes of April 3, 2023; accounts payable from April 4 - 17, 2023, in the amount of \$24,139.01; March 2023 bank reconciliation report; and the March 2023 Warren County Sheriff's Report. Second by Wadle. Ayes: Kinser, Wadle, Uttley and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: Rasmussen. Motion approved.

Mayor Hall opened the public hearing for FY2024 Milo City Budget on a motion by Kinser and second by Mason. Roll call vote: Ayes: Kinser, Wadle, Uttley and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: Rasmussen. Motion approved. Mayor Hall asked for public comments and there were none. Mayor Hall asked the Clerk for written comments and there were none. Mayor Hall closed the public hearing on a motion by Wadle and second by Mason. Roll call vote: Ayes: Kinser, Wadle, Uttley and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: Rasmussen. Then after review, a motion was made by Mason to approve Resolution 2023-12 approving the FY2024 Milo City Budget and directing the Clerk to make the necessary filings. Roll call vote: Ayes: Kinser, Wadle, Uttley and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: Rasmussen.

Under old business, Clerk Shared that there had been a change order on the wastewater improvement project resulting in approximately \$70,000 savings. The item will be on the May 1, 2023 agenda for approval. Mayor Hall shared that there is a meeting for engineers, contractors, Doug Hembry, Clerk and any Council person if they want to attend. The meeting will be at City Hall on Monday, April 24, 2023 at 1:00 p.m. Then, Eric Lubben, Access Systems, presented information regarding the copier update for City Hall. The Council reviewed information from Access Systems and from Midwest Office Technology. Uttley motioned to approve purchasing the suggested copier for City Hall from Access Systems. Second by Mason. Roll call vote: Ayes: Kinser, Wadle, Uttley and Mason. Navs: none. Absent: Rasmussen. Doug Hembry was absent and

no report was available.

Under new business, Council reviewed all listed items and Sheriff Carico and Deputy Bauer presented information for the law enforcement contract renegotiation. Discussion followed. Motion by Kinser and second by Uttley to approve renewing the 5 year law enforcement contract with the Warren County Sheriff's Office at a 4% annual increase. Roll call vote: Ayes: Kinser, Wadle, Uttley and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: Rasmussen. Then, motion by Uttley and second by Mason to approve the seasonal parks gardener contract with Cali Searles for the 2023 season. Roll call vote: Ayes: Kinser, Wadle, Uttley and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: Rasmussen. Next, motion by Kinser second by Wadle to approve Resolution 2023-13 approving use of the trail easement donations totaling \$10,200 for the North connector on the Milo Pedestrian Trail. Roll call vote: Ayes: Kinser, Wadle, Uttley and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: Rasmussen. Then, the Council asked the Clerk to contact Pride Concrete to provide an updated bid for the North connector on the Milo Pedestrian Trail that has a 5 foot wide walking path. The Clerk will contact Pride Concrete. Next, motion by Kinser second by Wadle to approve the Fy2023 City Budget Amendment and set for hearing on May 15, 2023 at 7:30 p.m. at Milo City Hall, 100 Main Street, Milo, Iowa. Roll call vote: Ayes: Kinser, Wadle, Uttley and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: Rasmussen.

There was no public in attendance. The Clerk shared that there was an incident in City Park and the south basketball backboard was shattered. The Warren County Sheriff responded and will work with the City Clerk to resolve the issue. Uttley expressed concern for the Lion's Club easements that allow the Milo Mud Run. The Clerk will contact the City Attorney to see if these easements are still in force.

Motion by Wadle to adjourn at 7:28 p.m. Second by Kinser. Ayes: All present. Motion approved.

Motion by Mason and second by Wadle to approve the amended agenda to note that Nancy Buss will not be in attendance. Ayes: Wadle, Rasmussen, Uttley and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: Kinser. Motion approved.

Motion by Mason to approve the consent agenda to include all Council meeting minutes of April 17, 2023; accounts payable from April 18 – May 1, 2023, in the amount of \$373,861.27; Second by Wadle. Ayes: Wadle, Rasmussen, Uttley and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: Kinser. Motion approved.

Mayor Hall accepted the verbal resignation of Verna Sevcik and recognized 16 years of service as the Milo City Park gardener and caretaker of the Main Street Planters. Motion by Mason and second by Wadle to approve Resolution 2023-16 accepting the verbal resignation of seasonal employee Verna Sevcik effective April 17, 2023. Ayes: Wadle, Rasmussen, Uttley and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: Kinser. Motion approved.

Under old business, council reviewed the Wastewater Treatment Facility Improvement items resulting in the following actions: Motion by Mason and second by Wadle to approve Payment 1 in the amount of \$321,503.99 to Blue Ribbon Builders for the construction contract. Ayes: Wadle, Rasmussen, Uttley and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: Kinser. Motion approved. Next, motion by Uttley and second by Rasmussen to approve Change Orders 1 – 8. Ayes: Wadle, Rasmussen, Uttley and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: Kinser. Motion approved. Then, Mayor Hall shared information from the monthly construction meeting. Motion by Mason second by Wadle to approve Hall Engineering's Monthly Progress Report 1. Ayes: Wadle, Rasmussen, Uttley and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: Kinser. Motion approved. After that fencing for the perimeter of the wastewater facility property was discussed with Doug Hembry stated that woven-wire farm fencing is fine for the area away from the trail but Council will need to determine if chain-link fencing would be good for along the trail. Discussion followed. Motion by Wadle to utilize farm-fencing with a top barbed wire for the entire perimeter of the wastewater

facility property. Second by Rasmussen. Ayes: Wadle, Rasmussen, Uttley and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: Kinser. Motion approved. Doug Hembry will notify Blue Ribbon Builders.

Council departmental reports: Kinser-public safety: absent-no report/questions. Rasmussen-utilities: no report/questions. Wadle-streets: asked that the streets and potholes continue to be looked and fixed and thanked Doug for what has been done so far. Uttleyparks: reported that the Lion's Club will be placing benches in Centennial Park for public use. Masongeneral items: reported that she had been asked if the building debris on Main Street would be cleaned up by July 4, 2023. Mayor Hall stated that the City does not have control over that. Then Mason asked about the hollow tree in the City right-of-way that was mentioned at the last meeting. Hembry said Rohrich Tree Service has been contacted. Doug Hembry reported on upcoming culvert maintenance, water stop replacements, street maintenance and normal Spring items. Hembry asked the Mayor and Council to look at the Fire Department new hanging furnace because he was not satisfied with the installation work done by Country Propane, Heating & Cooling. The Council went to the sallyport and viewed the installation. Hembry stated that it looked like a handyman installed it, not a professional. Mayor Hall agreed. Hembry went on to say the meter and the gas lines are not plumb up and down, the exhaust should have been done differently with less bends. Rasmussen noticed that there was not a gas flex-line. Motion approved.



Now I'm going to tell a story about another kind of success. And I tell it as it was told me. A few weeks back, a fellow Milo Lion went into Milo's Peoples Savings Bank to transact some business. Branch Manager Connie Frasier noticed her patron was slurring his speech. Knowing this to be a possible symptom of a stroke, Connie spoke up. She correctly advised immediate medical attention. Our friend took her words to heart. He went to the hospital, had the stroke confirmed and treated. A couple days later, he returned home safe and well. To talk to him today, no one would know anything happened. If not for quick thinking, and quick action, things might have been far worse. Connie, be as humble as you like, but you did something special and important. Your grateful neighbors thank you.

F.A.S.T. is a useful mnemonic phrase typically used to identify a stroke quickly. It gathers three main symptoms. F (face)- the person has to grin, and you have to try notice if one side of their face begins to hang. A (arms)- ask them to lift both of their arms, is one of them drifting downward? S (speech)- ask the person to say a simple sentence- is their talk unclear or strange? And T (time)- instantly call 9-1-1 if you note any of these signs. Time can be either a friend or foe.



#### **CURFEW FOR MINORS**

Milo Ordinance Chapter 46

City of Milo Ordinance 46.01 CURFEW. "The Council has determined that a curfew for minors is necessary to promote the public health, safety, morals, and general welfare of the City and specifically to reinforce the primary authority and responsibility of adults responsible for minors; to protect the public from the illegal acts of minors committed after the curfew hour; and to protect minors from improper influences and criminal activity that prevail in public places after the curfew hour...". "2. Curfew Established. No minor shall be in a public place between the following hours: Sunday - Thursday 11:00 p.m. - 5:00 a.m. and Friday - Saturday 12:00 midnight - 5:00 a.m. .....". The complete ordinance is available online at cityofmilo.com under the government tab or pick up copy at City Hall.

### **BURNING PROHIBITED**

Milo Ordinance 105 & 135

City of Milo Ordinance 135.08 BURNING PROHIBITED. "No person shall burn any trash, leaves, rubbish or other combustible material....". City of Milo Ordinance 105.05 OPEN BURNING RESTRICTED. "No person shall allow, cause or permit open burning of combustible materials...". The complete ordinance is available at www.cityofmilo.com/government.

The Milo City Dump, located at the south edge of Milo, is open for citizens to use. Note that the only items allowed in the City Dump are concrete, dirt and yard vegetation (including trees) – please be sure to follow the posted guidelines! Absolutely no treated lumber, building materials, or trash!
