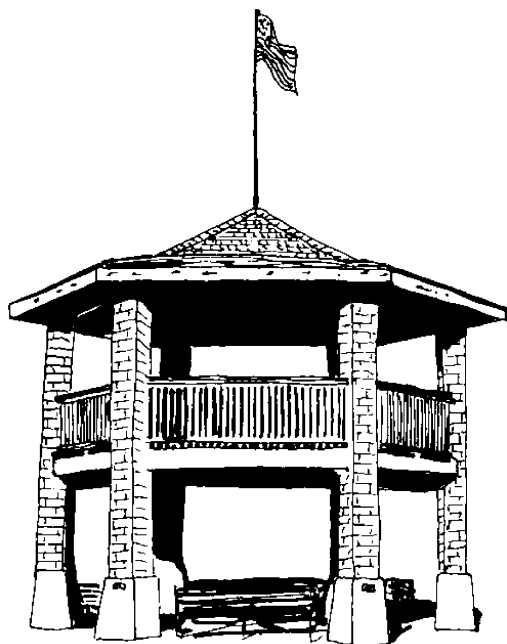

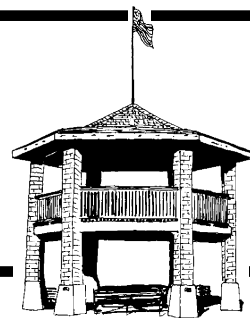

MINUTES of the CITY OF MILO COUNCIL MEETING

CITY HALL, 100 MAIN ST, MILO, IOWA –
MONDAY, AUGUST 7, 2023

Milo City Council was called to order by Mayor Hall at 7:00 p.m. City Council answering the Clerk's roll call: Kinser, Wadle, Rasmussen, Uttley and Mason. Mayor Hall administered the Pledge of Allegiance.

Motion by Kinser and second by Mason to approve the amended agenda to include the removal of item 6. Crystal McIntyre; addition of item 7.a.ix. MidAmerican Extension for Wastewater Facility Update; and addition of item 9.m. building permit application. Ayes: Kinser, Wadle, Rasmussen, Uttley and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: none. Motion approved.

Motion by Mason and second by Wadle to approve the consent agenda to include all Council meeting minutes of July 10, 2023; accounts payable from July 11 – August 7, 2023, in the amount of \$231,915.35; and July 2023 Warren County Sheriff Report. Ayes: Kinser, Wadle, Rasmussen, Uttley and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: none. Motion approved.

Under old business, Nancy Buss of Hall Engineering spoke regarding the removal of the MBBR Ares Unit should maintenance be needed. Council discussed and Buss offered to draft a letter to TriplePoint asking for a reduced fee should their services be needed. And then after Council reviewed the remaining items they resulted in the following actions: Motion by Kinser and second by Wadle to accept the Progress Meeting Notes of July 31, 2023. Ayes: Kinser, Wadle, Rasmussen, Uttley and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: none. Motion approved. Next, motion Uttley and second by Mason to approve Change Order No. 9. Ayes: Kinser, Wadle, Rasmussen, Uttley and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: none. Motion approved. Change Order No. 10 was tabled to the next meeting. Afterward, motion by Kinser and second by Wadle to approve Construction Monitoring Report No. 4. Ayes: Kinser, Wadle, Rasmussen, Uttley and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: none. Motion approved. Next, motion by Mason second by Wadle to approve Payment 4 to Blue Ribbon Builders in the amount of \$136,594.88. Ayes: Kinser, Wadle, Rasmussen, Uttley and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: none. Motion approved. Then, motion by Kinser and second by Mason to approve the contract payment to Hall Engineering the amount of \$14,260.25. Ayes: Kinser, Wadle, Rasmussen, Uttley and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: none. Motion approved. Then, motion by Mason second by Kinser

to approve the contract payment to Terracon in the amount of \$2,162.50. Ayes: Kinser, Wadle, Rasmussen, Uttley and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: none. Motion approved. Finally, motion by Wadle second by Mason to approve agreement with MidAmerican Energy for the electrical extension to serve the Wastewater Facility update. Ayes: Kinser, Wadle, Rasmussen, Uttley and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: none. Motion approved. Mayor Hall then addressed Council regarding the siren indicating that we are awaiting electrical bids and that the siren had been purchased.

Council departmental reports: Kinser-public safety: no report/questions. Rasmussen-utilities: no report/questions. Wadle-streets: no report/questions. Uttley-parks: no report/questions. Mason- General: no report/questions. Doug Hembry, Operations Director, no report.

Under new business, Council reviewed all items resulting in the following actions: Motion by Uttley and second by Wadle to approve Resolution 2023-31 approving and authorizing a form of Loan and Disbursement Agreement by and between the City of Milo, Iowa, and the Iowa Finance Authority, and authorizing and providing for the issuance and securing the payment of \$3,787,000 Sewer Revenue Capital Loan Notes, Series 2023B, of the City of Milo, Iowa, under the provisions of the Code of Iowa, and providing for a method of payment of said Notes; Approval of the Tax Exemption Certificate. Roll call vote: Ayes: Kinser, Wadle, Rasmussen, Uttley and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: none. Motion approved. Then, motion by Mason second by Wadle to approve Resolution 2023-23 transferring FY2023 residual fire department budget to fire capital improvement. Ayes: Kinser, Wadle, Rasmussen, Uttley and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: none. Motion approved. And then motion by Mason second by Rasmussen to approve Resolution 2023-24 transferring FY2023 residual EMS department budget to EMS capital improvement. Ayes: Kinser, Wadle, Rasmussen, Uttley and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: none. Motion approved. Next, motion by Uttley second by Rasmussen to approve Resolution 2023-25 transferring funds from sewer checking into sewer capital improvement for the wastewater project. Ayes: Kinser, Wadle, Rasmussen, Uttley and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: none. Motion approved. Then, motion by Wadle second by Kinser to approve Resolution 2023-26 transferring unpaid interest from debt service fund into the EMS capital improvement fund due to interest savings due to paying off the EMS loan early. Ayes: Kinser, Wadle, Rasmussen,

Ayes: Kinser, Wadle, Rasmussen, Uttley and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: none. Motion approved. Then, motion by Mason second by Wadle to approve Resolution 2023-28 transferring matured Certificates of Deposit into city accounts and investing funds into 7 month Certificate of Deposit accounts with People's Bank. Next, motion by Mason second by Rasmussen approving Resolution 2023-29 changing the City Clerk's work hours effective July 1, 2023. Ayes: Kinser, Wadle, Rasmussen, Uttley and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: none. Motion approved. Then, motion by Wadle second by Mason to approve Resolution 2023-30 accepting changes and updating the Milo Employee Handbook. Ayes: Kinser, Wadle, Rasmussen, Uttley and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: none. Motion approved. Afterward, upon a motion by Uttley and second by Rasmussen to adjust the water ordinance to increase the utility deposit for new utility customers to \$250. Ayes: Kinser, Wadle, Rasmussen, Uttley and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: none. Motion approved. Clerk was directed to prepare the ordinance change. Then, motion by Kinser and second by Rasmussen to adjust the water ordinance to reflect changing the shutoff fee to \$25 penalty for the first shutoff and \$50 penalty for the second shutoff and every shutoff thereafter. Ayes: Kinser, Wadle, Rasmussen, Uttley and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: none. Motion approved. The Clerk is directed to prepare the ordinance change. There were no public comments. Council remarks included discussion of private properties that need

mowed or debris removed and asked that Doug Hembry make a list and that the Clerk send notices. Uttley asked if Windstream could fix their boxes that are opened or falling apart in Milo, Hembry will contact them. Uttley also expressed concern for the Legion building's west wall, Clerk said she heard that the Legion was meeting soon discuss their options. Hembry said Darrell Goering expressed his thanks to Milo for their patience and the fencing going on to say that the Milo Locker is hoping to begin building next year. Wadle was concerned about the condition of the city's planters and Hembry said he could have them sandblasted and painted. Council agreed that this would be a good maintenance choice for the planters. Wadle shared that September 17th will be the 8th year for Wine Down to Milo and the event has grown tremendously and this year will be a fun time for all attendees. Then, Council reviewed the health, safety and information handout titled Prevent Heat Illness.

Motion by Mason and second by Rasmussen to adjourn at 8:04 p.m. Ayes: All present. Motion approved.

Milo Ordinance 105 & 135

City of Milo Ordinance 135.08 BURNING PROHIBITED. "No person shall burn any trash, leaves, rubbish or other combustible material....". City of Milo Ordinance 105.05 OPEN BURNING RESTRICTED. "No person shall allow, cause or permit open burning of combustible materials...". The complete ordinance is available at www.cityofmilo.com/government.

The Milo City Dump, located at the south edge of Milo, is open for citizens to use. Note that the only items allowed in the City Dump are concrete, dirt and yard vegetation (including trees) – please be sure to follow the posted guidelines! **Absolutely no treated lumber, building materials, or trash!**

Milo Ordinance 69.11

When the National Weather Service predicts that two or more inches of snow or ice will fall or has fallen within the Milo area, street parking is not allowed.

The parking ban shall be in effect for a period of 24 hours after the snow ceases and the blowing stops or when the snow has been cleared from the city streets. Any car found in violation of this ordinance will be towed at the owner's expense.

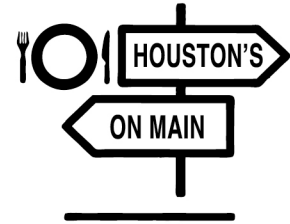
