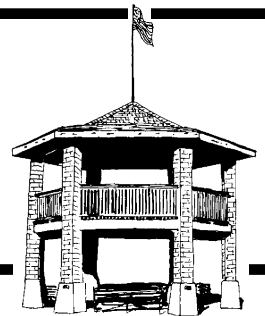

CITY HALL, 100 MAIN ST, MILO, IOWA –
MONDAY, JANUARY 15, 2024

Milo City Council was called to order by Mayor Hall at 7:00 p.m. City Council answering the Clerk's roll call: Kinser, Wadle, Griggs and Mason. Rasmussen was absent.

Motion by Wadle and second by Mason to approve agenda. Ayes: Kinser, Wadle, Griggs and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: Rasmussen. Motion approved.

Motion by Kinser and second by Mason to approve the consent agenda to include all Council meeting minutes of January 2, 2024; and accounts payable from January 3 - 15, 2024 in the amount of \$7,327.08; December 2023 bank reconciliation report; and December 2023 Warren County Sheriff's Report. Ayes: Kinser, Wadle, Griggs and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: Rasmussen. Motion approved.

Council reviewed all old business items resulting in the following actions: Mayor Hall noted that the next Wastewater Project progress meeting is scheduled for January 29, 2024 and invited council to join. Motion by Kinser and second by Wadle to approve Trail change order 1 – delete item 0200 construction survey. Ayes: Kinser, Wadle, Griggs and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: Rasmussen. Motion approved. Mayor Hall tabled the North LED sign bids due to not having an updated bid.

Council departmental reports: Kinser-public safety: no report/questions. Rasmussen-utilities: absent - no report/questions. Wadle-streets: Wadle thanked city staff for doing a great job with clearing the streets after the blizzard. Council agreed. Griggs-parks: Inquired who was along the trail placing stakes. Mayor and Clerk thought it was a subcontractor of Elder Corporation staking the elevation in preparation for trail construction. Clerk will contact McClure Engineering for a definite answer. Mason-general – no report/questions. Doug Hembry, Operations Director – absent.

Council reviewed all new business resulting in the following actions: Motion by Kinser second by Griggs to approve a parcel split request located outside the Milo city limits near 17270 Hwy G58, Milo, Iowa. Ayes: Kinser, Wadle, Griggs and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: Rasmussen. Motion approved. Council then reviewed the budget estimation and Clerk explained the different line items and where the revenue for each expense comes from. Discussion followed. Mayor Hall shared the district map and information for the newly approved 5 person Warren County Board of

Supervisors that will be elected in November 2024.

There were no public comments. Mayor Hall invited Council to the Warren County Resource Enhancement A Program (REAP) meeting to be held January 16, 2024 in Milo City Hall at 8:00 a.m.

Motion by Wadle and second by Mason to adjourn at 7:28 p.m. Ayes: All present. Motion approved.

REGISTER YOUR DOG

Milo Ordinance Chapters 55 & 56

Milo City Ordinances Chapter 55 and Chapter 56 pertain to pet owners and their responsibilities while keeping dogs within the city limits of Milo.

There have been multiple complaints of dogs running loose within the city limits. This is dangerous for the dogs and for Milo citizens who are walking within the community. Another issue has been **excessive barking** at all hours of the day and night. Not only are both of these issues disrespectful, but they are also unlawful. City of Milo Ordinance Chapter 55 explains the responsibilities of pet owners within the city limits of Milo.

Do you own a dog that is of the Bull Terrier breed, Staffordshire Bull Terrier breed, American Pit Bull breed, American Staffordshire Terrier breed, a dog of mixed breed including the aforementioned types, or any dog with the appearance and characteristics of being predominately of the aforementioned breeds?

If you answered **YES**, you are **required by law** to register your pet with the City of Milo and provide veterinarian certified proof of breed and proof of liability insurance. You must also adhere to the housing and restraint requirements of this type of dog within the City of Milo. Milo Ordinance Chapter 56 outlines the owner's responsibilities when choosing a pet of this breed.

Milo City Council was called to order by Mayor Hall at 7:01 p.m. City Council answering the Clerk's roll call: Kinser, Wadle, Griggs and Mason. Rasmussen was absent. Mayor Hall administered the Pledge of Allegiance.

Motion by Mason and second by Kinser to approve agenda. Ayes: Kinser, Wadle, Griggs and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: Rasmussen. Motion approved.

Motion by Mason and second by Wadle to approve the consent agenda to include all Council meeting minutes of January 15, 2024; and accounts payable from January 16 – February 5, 2024 in the amount of \$159,393.26; and the January 2024 bank reconciliation report. Ayes: Kinser, Wadle, Griggs and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: Rasmussen. Motion approved.

Council reviewed all old business items resulting in the following actions: Motion by Kinser and second by Griggs to approve Payment 9 in the amount of \$93,448.25 to Blue Ribbon Builders. Ayes: Kinser, Wadle, Griggs and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: Rasmussen. Motion approved. Then, motion by Wadle and second by Mason to approve the contract payment to Hall Engineering in the amount of \$2,315.75. Ayes: Kinser, Wadle, Uttley and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: Rasmussen. Mayor and Council acknowledged and thanked the Milo Lion's Club for their donation of \$30,000 to be used in the construction of the Milo Trail and noted that Milo Lion's Club has previously donated \$12,497 towards the Milo Trail. Mayor Hall tabled the North LED sign bids due to exploring fundraising opportunities.

Council departmental reports: Kinser-public safety: no report/questions. Rasmussen-utilities: absent - no report/questions. Wadle-streets: no report/questions. Griggs-parks: Inquired if the shelter posts should be replaced temporarily due to safety issues. Hembry felt the posts would suffice until the project can be started. Mayor Hall shared that she intends to write a Warren County Philanthropic Legacy Grant for the City Park phased project. Mason-general – no report/questions. Doug Hembry, Operations Director – shared information about upcoming street repair projects, parks projects and basic winter maintenance. Mayor thanked Doug and his crew for getting the streets cleared after the last big snow storms. Wadle agreed. Griggs asked when the changes to the yield stop signs would occur. Clerk said that the ordinance needs to be approved first and it will be part of other upcoming ordinance changes.

Library Director, Renee Hembry, presented to Mayor and Council the happenings at the Milo Public Library. Hembry noted that the building fund is nearing \$200,000 and circulation of books is holding steady. Technology updates will be increasing concerning cyber security. Children's programming continues to be well attended and the selection of STEAM, maker's space and other sensory items has expanded. There is a K-6th grade after school reading/story time and a toddler/preschool time which is a lot of fun. Upcoming will be a school age game night. Adult programming has expanded and will include a new program called Coffee, Confections and Connections. Adult board game night has become a monthly fixture at the Library along with Adult coloring night and Bingo for all ages. Some upcoming adult programs will include Floral Arranging, Succession Gardening; Byers' Dairy Farm Fresh Milk; and Historian Kathy Wilson just to name a few! The Summer Reading Program: Read, Renew, Repeat will have a presentation by Keisha Thompson. Also available is the Adventure Pass which is funded through Warren County. It provides free tickets (2 adult and 2 children) to the Blank Park Zoo, Botanical Center, Science Center and the Des Moines Children's Museum.

Council reviewed all new business resulting in the following actions: Motion by Wadle second by Mason to approve the FY2025 Milo Library Budget. Ayes: Kinser, Wadle, Griggs and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: Rasmussen. Motion approved. Next, motion by Kinser second by Griggs to approve March 30, 2024 for the Annual Milo Egg Hunt. Renee Hembry will coordinate the event with Peoples Bank. Ayes: Kinser, Wadle, Griggs and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: Rasmussen.

Motion approved. Then, motion by Mason and second by Wadle to approve Resolution 2024-01 approving moving funds from matured certificates of deposit and purchasing new certificates of deposit at Community 1st Credit Union. Ayes: Kinser, Wadle, Griggs and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: Rasmussen. Motion approved. Afterward, motion by Griggs and second by Kinser to amend the trash/recycle contract upon the request of TRM Disposal, LLC and direct the City Clerk to adjust the ordinance. Ayes: Kinser, Wadle, Griggs and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: Rasmussen. Motion approved. Next, motion by Wadle and second by Mason to approve a city upcharge increase of \$0.50 per household for the annual city cleanup. Ayes: Kinser, Wadle, Griggs and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: Rasmussen. Motion

Ayes: Kinser, Wadle, Griggs and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: Rasmussen. Motion approved. Then, motion by Kinser second by Mason to approve Doug Hembry as 2023 Volunteer of the Year and directed the City Clerk to order the award and name plate. Ayes: Kinser, Wadle, Griggs and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: Rasmussen. Motion approved. Afterward, motion by Griggs second by Kinser to approve the FY2025 IMPACT \$600 funding request. Ayes: Kinser, Wadle, Griggs and Mason. Nays: none. Absent: Rasmussen. Motion approved. Next, motion by Wadle and second by Mason to approve the FY2025 budget levy and submit the Warren County Auditor for public hearing on April 1, 2024. Council reviewed the health and safety handout “How to Reduce your Heart Disease Risk.”

There were no public comments. Mayor Hall shared information about the March 6, 2024 Local Leader’s Day at the Capitol that Council can attend. Clerk shared that she has written a \$5,000 grant to be used to defray costs of the Trail’s north connecting concrete.

BURNING PROHIBITED

Milo Ordinance 105 & 135

City of Milo Ordinance 135.08 BURNING PROHIBITED. “No person shall burn any trash, leaves, rubbish or other combustible material...”. City of Milo Ordinance 105.05 OPEN BURNING RESTRICTED. “No person shall allow, cause or permit open burning of combustible materials...”. The complete ordinance is available at www.cityofmilo.com/government.

The Milo City Dump, located at the south edge of Milo, is open for citizens to use. Note that the only items allowed in the City Dump are concrete, dirt and yard vegetation (including trees) – please be sure to follow the posted guidelines! **Absolutely no treated lumber, building materials, or trash!**

JUNK VEHICLES PROHIBITED

Milo Ordinance Chapter 51

This article is a reminder to Milo citizens that there is a law prohibiting junk and junk vehicles. Ordinance § 51 Junk and Junk Vehicles states that it is unlawful for any person to store, accumulate, or allow to remain on any private property within the corporate limits of the City any junk or junk vehicle. Please note that “junk vehicle” means any vehicle legally placed in storage with the County Treasurer or unlicensed and which has any of the following characteristics: broken glass, broken or loose parts, habitat for nuisance animals or insects, flammable fuel, inoperable, defective or obsolete condition. Licensing of such vehicle shall not constitute a defense. A “vehicle” is every device that a person or property can be transported in without use of human power such as: automobile, motorcycle, tractor, buggy, farm machinery, etc. The complete ordinance is available for review online at www.cityofmilo.com/government.

SIDEWALK AND TREE MAINTENANCE

Milo Ordinance 135,136 & 151

The City of Milo is providing an ordinance reminder to citizens that it is the property owner's responsibility to maintain trees, shrubs and sidewalks.

Trees which hang over sidewalks need to be trimmed to a height of 8 feet; if the tree hangs over the street it needs to be trimmed to a height of 15 feet above the surface of the street.

Property owners are responsible for sidewalk installation for new homes; and for all sidewalk maintenance including repairs and ensuring the sidewalk is clear of debris and vegetation. The complete Milo City Ordinance Chapters 135, 136 and 151 are available at City Hall or online at cityofmilo.com/government.

After putting your effort into trimming branches, raking grass/leaves and fixing sidewalks; please remember the Milo City Dump, located south of Milo, is open for citizens to use. Note that the only items allowed in the City Dump are concrete, dirt and yard vegetation (including trees) – please be sure to follow the posted guidelines! **Absolutely no treated lumber, building materials, or trash!**

Hometown Pride

Since last March we have been working together to raise the funds for the electronic reader board. The sign going up is going to cost more than the current one by the school because this one is going to be digitally enhanced with animated images that will allow for more information to be advertised. To cut on some of the cost we are using the existing pole from the previous sign. Still, for a 3'x7' full colored sign displaying images in both sides it's approximately \$30k. Our committee has currently raised almost \$18k from donations, grants, and fundraisers.

We have had some amazing support through donations from some local businesses and organizations already and wanted to acknowledge them! They are: Milo Locker, Southeast Warren FFA, Rocketman, Steve Bonnett, Milo 4th of July, Southeast Warren Schools, SEW Little League, Warren County Tire, Houston's on Main, SEW Partners in Education (P.I.E.), Peoples Bank, Promotions Plus, Community Projects, Diane Johnston, and The Goode Place. We applied for and received two grants; Warren County Philanthropic, and also Warren County Master Gardeners.

Donors can advertise or display a message on the reader board once a month at no charge! All donors are currently able to advertise on our existing sign. For non-donors, messages related to birthdays, anniversaries or other celebratory messages are \$10 for 1 day. Local businesses can advertise for 3 days for \$10. Nonprofit organizations can have their message displayed at no charge. It is estimated that 2,000 people view the messages daily.

We feel the sign is going to be a benefit to the community by not only displaying information for our residents but will greatly aid in slowing down traffic to a safe speed.

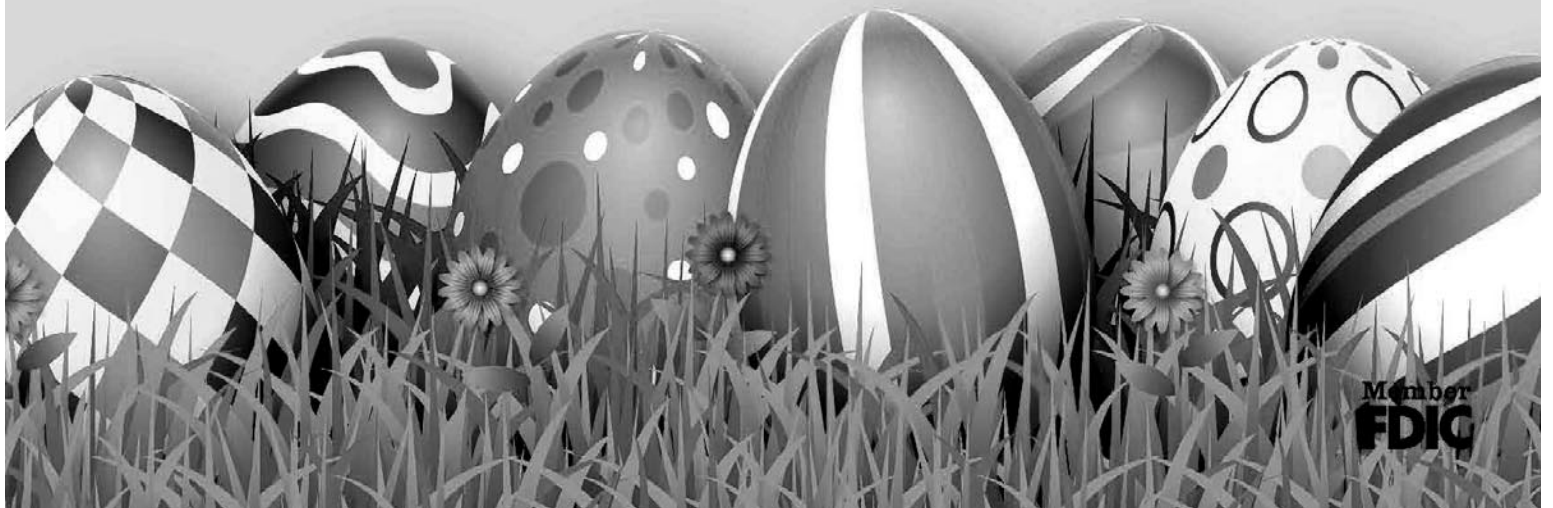

NO PARKING ON CITY STREETS DURING SNOW EMERGENCIES

Milo Ordinance 69.11

When the National Weather Service predicts that two or more inches of snow or ice will fall or has fallen within the Milo area, street parking is not allowed. The parking ban shall be in effect for a period of 24 hours after the snow ceases and the blowing stops or when the snow has been cleared from the city streets. Any car found in violation of this ordinance will be towed at the owner's expense.

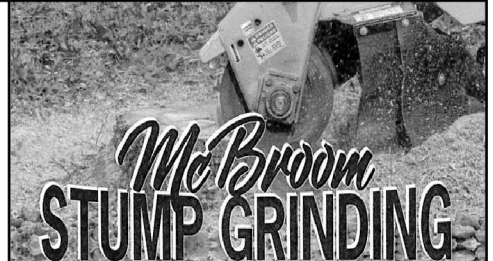
